GS1 standards development efforts for Transport and Logistics (T&L) are now an essential core activity of our organisation, fully integrated into the work done by the GS1 Global Office and by our 111 GS1 Member Organisations (MOs) around the world.

Many organisations have already seen the benefits of working with GS1 standards including improved efficiency, increased visibility of the flow of goods and shipments, more efficient handling and inventory management, increased security of distribution, faster operations, and smoother exchanges with Customs and other government agencies.

GS1 Transport & Logistics Vision & Mission

The Vision of GS1 regarding Transport and Logistics (T&L) is to further the wide spread use of GS1 Global Standards and Solutions by supply chains stakeholders with a focus on supply chain efficiency and visibility to facilitate interoperability on both a business process as well as a technical level.





Transport & Logistics Industry User Group

The Transport & Logistics Industry User Group (IUG) is the means by which GS1 engages with T&L organisations, Key Trading partners and GS1 MOs.

This IUG exists to bring together stakeholders within the T&L industry to discuss and identify common needs that may be addressed by the GS1 System. The IUG provides support to its industry to understand and adopt relevant parts of the GS1 System. From time to time, the IUG may also identify areas of business need within the industry that are not currently addressed by the GS1 System, but which may be addressed by enhancing the GS1 System by creating new system components (standards, guidelines, etc.) or enhancing existing system components.

The identification of an unmet business need may lead to a work effort to enhance the GS1 System through the Global Standards Management Process (GSMP).

Collaboration

GS1 works in close collaboration with the following organisations to ensure that GS1 standards are endorsed by these bodies and gain full international recognition.

WCO: World Customs Organisation and GS1 signed a Memorandum of Understanding

ISO: GS1's working relationship with ISO is a particularly long and active one.

UN/CEFACT: UN/CEFACT is the United Nations Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business. GS1 actively participates in the development of EDIFACT and the future UN/CEFACT XML standard (UN/XML).

BIC: The Bureau International des Containers et du Transport Intermodal (B.I.C.) signed an MOU with GS1

UPU: GS1 signed a memorandum of understanding with the Universal Postal Union (UPU).
