

## GS1 Healthcare – AIDC Application Standard For Healthcare

Date: 18-November-2008

This is a GSMP **Call-to-Action** to recruit users from all industries and from everywhere in the world to bring their expertise, commitment, and contribution to a new GSMP work area.

The information herein gives a general description of the new work area and the **Work Group (WG)** that is being formed to accomplish the work. For information on how to join this work area, please refer to Section 12 below.

### 1. Objective/Scope of the AIDC Application Standard For Healthcare Work Group

- Create a Business Requirements Analysis Document (BRAD) to record the global business requirements for product and package labeling of healthcare products in the global healthcare supply chain. The marking and labeling is for automatic identification and data capture (AIDC) with the specific focus on patient safety. For this Call To Action the supply chain starts at the manufacturer with the finished healthcare product and ends at the point of patient care. Healthcare products within the scope of work are: Pharmaceuticals including Vaccines, Biologicals and Therapeutic Nutritionals, Medical Devices including Implants. (Note: Medical Instruments are excluded from this request and are planned for Phase 2 on the GS1 Healthcare Roadmap.) The AIDC carriers include both bar codes and RFID tags. The GS1 Healthcare AIDC Application Standards Work Team has gathered global business, data and carrier requirements since their formation in October 2006. All this information will be made available to this group.
- Create a GS1 General Specification Change Notice (GSCN) for the enhancement of the GS1 General Specification. The GSCN is the approved document to be developed, approved and ratified. GSCN's are the recognized standard until incorporated into the GS1 General Specification during the annual publication cycle. The AIDC Application Standard for Healthcare which highlights the changes to the sections of the GS1 General Specification will become attached to the covering GSCN form.

### 2. Scope Constraints of the AIDC Application Standard For Healthcare Work Group

GSMP WGs and BRGs must adhere to the GS1 Standards Development Methodologies to assure their scope and deliverables, upon which the work of the other GSMP groups depends.

Generally, the team must operate within the following context:

- Develop documents that capture the business and technical requirements
- Develop documents that capture the additional considerations and concerns that were discussed during the group's calls and physical meetings.

This work effort is based off of Change Request: **#08-000263**



### 3. Expertise Required

This is a call for business information and business information technology experts for the **AIDC Application Standard For Healthcare Work Group**. The experts should represent all stakeholders in the supply chain to have proper representation on the WG/BRG. The intent is to have balanced membership from the **Global Healthcare Sector and FMCG Healthcare Products** user community to define and establish proper global standards with the clear intention of implementation of this application standard.

### 4. Area's Affected

The task of this work group will affect the GS1 General Specifications Publication Team as the output from this work group will become an input to their annual GS1 General Specification publication activities. The Application Standard for Healthcare will be attachments to the General Specification Change Notice (GSCN).

This work group will maintain a liaison with other GS1 Healthcare work groups to assure harmonization among work products.

This work group will collaborate with the Local Community Network via the LCN Global Agenda and surveys.

### 5. Distribution for Call to Action
