



## Quarterly GSMP Management Report October - December 2008



## Overview

The GSMP Management Report was created to give a high level overview of the state of GSMP and recent outcomes. This issue covers the period of October - December 2008.

## Highlights of the Quarter

Following are the key GSMP highlights of October - December 2008:

GS1 General Specifications version 9 delivered to the Community	This release of the General Specifications coincides with the newly implemented process of Gen Spec Change Notifications - which communicate approved changes immediately GS1 MOs via GS1 Online.
"CIC Response" Implementation Guidelines for GDSN Released!	The GDSN Trade Item Implementation Guide was updated to include guidelines on how the CIC Response message along with the CIC States, Status Codes and the CIC Corrective Action Codes should be used in the Global Data Synchronization Network (GDSN).
The foundation Stone of the GS1 Architecture Now Ratified	After a comprehensive approval process, including two public review cycles, the GS1 Architecture Principles have now been finalised and ratified by the GS1 Board Committee for Standards.
Swedish transport industry to develop e-com solutions within GSMP eCom Logistics Standards Work Group (WG)	Since the 1990s, the Swedish transport industry has used the well functioning standard Pharos, based on EDIFACT, for communication between sellers and buyers of transport services. For third-party logistics, a standard based on EANCOM is used. The GS1 keys SSCC and GLN are also widely used in the sector, which makes GS1 the obvious choice for continued standardisation work.
GDSN launches important new initiatives	Books Extension, Chemical Ingredients, GDSN Validation Rules
GSMP creates process changes to support sector-specific user groups such as GS1 Healthcare.	For several months, GSMP and GS1 Healthcare have worked to produce fundamentally important changes to the process which will allow the Healthcare sector to use GSMP efficiently.
Traceability BRG Launches	The Traceability BRG will process on-going continuous improvement to GS1 traceability standards including the Global Traceability Standard (GTS) and Global Traceability Conformance Programme (GTCP).
GSMP Delivers new GDSN solution for Television industry	GDSN is beginning efforts to expand marketing attributes around its products.

## GSMP Work Analysis

The GSMP work analysis communicates the RESULTS of GSMP work effort completed and the new work that has come in.

### Key Takeaways:

- Europe continues leading the submission of Change Requests
- The lower volume of GDSN CR's represents a migration away from Fast Track CR's and the new model of developing attributes as a GROUP by product classification type. The overall NUMBER of attributes year on year has gone up significantly as a result (see PCN on "Specific Technical Characteristic" Extension)

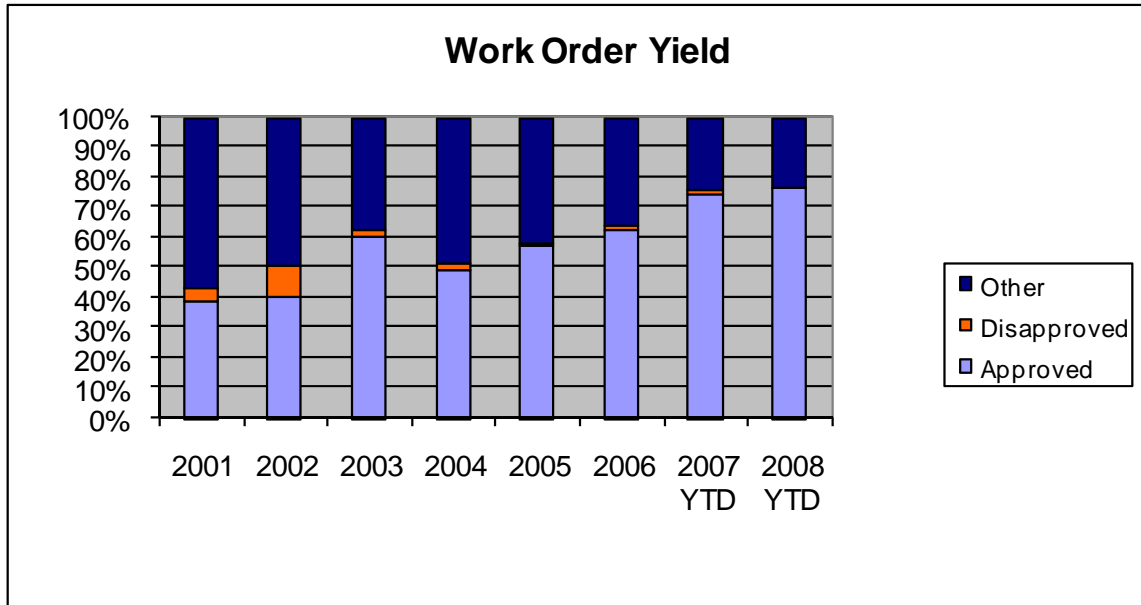

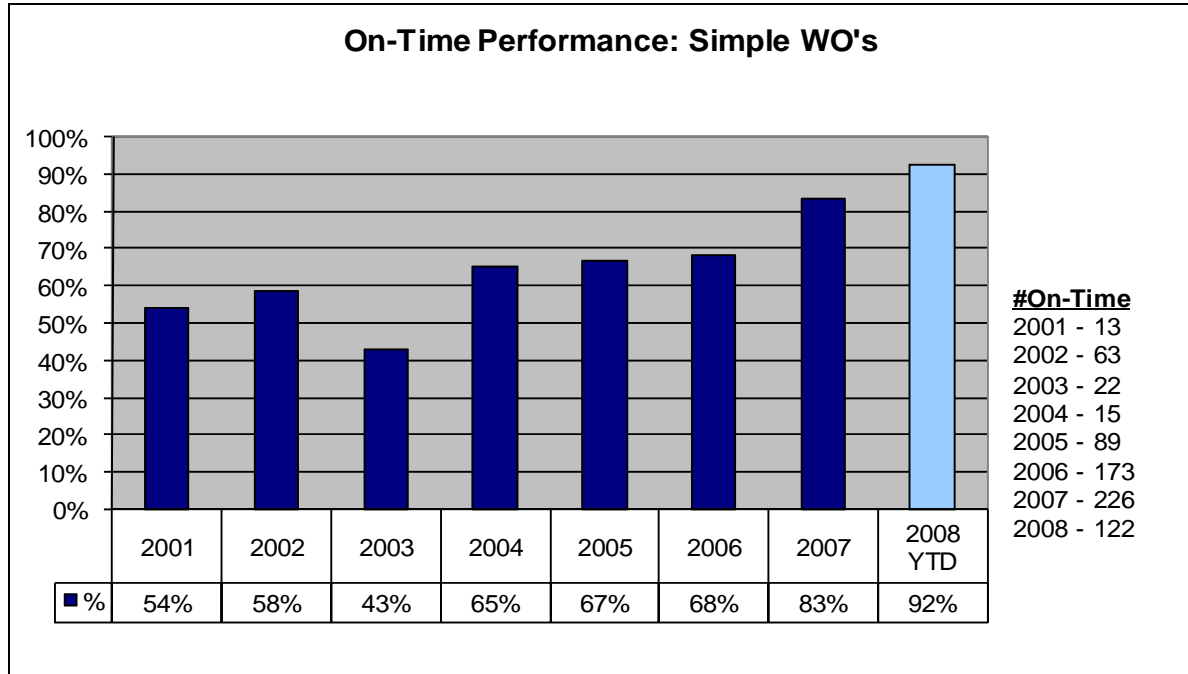
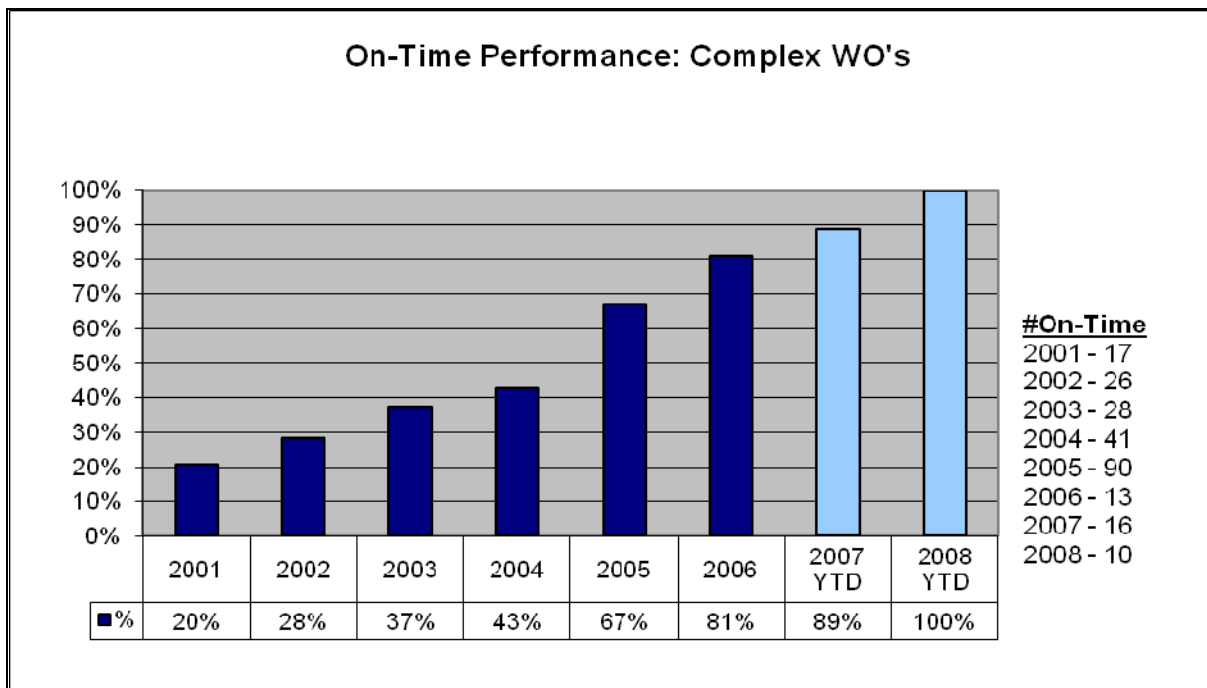


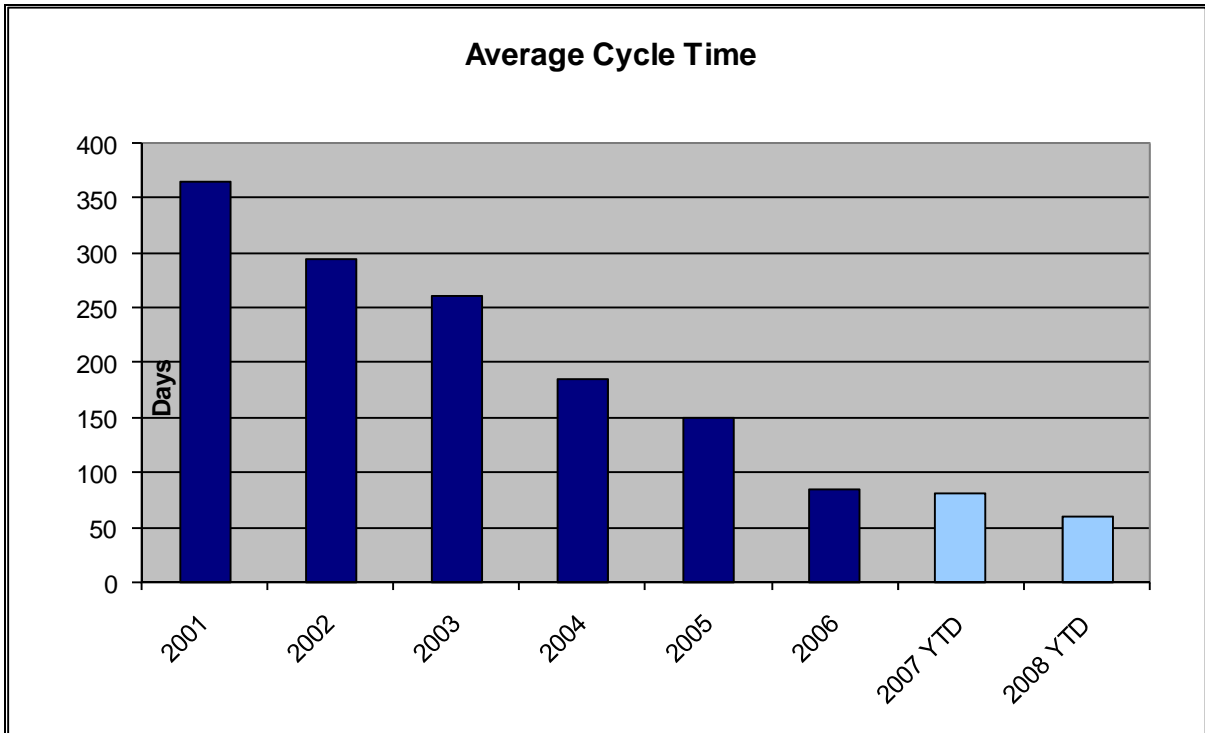
