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









Key Actions for Acute Providers (Hospitals)

- All Trusts will be <u>required</u> to develop a Trust Board approved <u>plan</u> for GS1 and PEPPOL compliance by <u>31st March 201</u>
- All Trusts <u>should</u> have a <u>Catalogue</u> <u>Management</u> system that accesses Master Data from a nationally established Product Information Management (PIM) system.
- NHS Providers should include plans for UDI in their Trust Board approved GS1/Peppol adoption plan
- Regularly provide procurement data to the UK Government to enable National price benchmarking











eProcurement System Complexity!
