

Since 2013, Derby have been rolling out scanning at point of use via a wristband issued to every inpatient, backed up by a catalogue and scanning system that uses GS1 standards to enable them to:


- Scan and check inpatients. Each member of staff also has their own barcode
- Track scopes/instrumentation to patients
- Track theatre and stockroom consumption
- Attribute cost to scope/instrumentation use

Benefits

Product recall

When recalls take place, they can easily identify all patients and products that may have been affected - making it quicker and easier for the required actions to take place.

Stock levels automatically updated

Scanning everything in the theatre also means that stock levels are automatically updated, triggering automated orders.

Patient-level costing

As equipment and implants are recorded against the patient, by also linking cost, staff and time information, a more complete and accurate procedure cost is calculated.

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
