

Meeting stakeholders' needs by blending HRI and regulatory requirements

The GS1 system requires printing both the GS1 barcode and the HRI that represents all the information encoded within that GS1 barcode




- Shows a human exactly what's in a barcode
- Is used in addition to the barcode, particularly if the barcode does not read

Challenge

- → Healthcare is complex Many countries have different requirements
- Regulators are requiring more data in barcodes


 E.g. Batch information and serial numbers
- → Lack of space
 The need for both regulated text and HRI
- → Technical challenges


 Barcodes are not part of the pre-printed artwork but instead have to be printed during production of the product



Solution


As a general rule, the law always supersedes the standards. Where it's not possible to apply both HRI and non-HRI text it's possible to combine them using the following methods:





The selection of data titles may be determined by the manufacturer based on regulatory, local language requirements, relevant standards (e.g. ISO/IEC 15223) or appropriate abbreviations
