

Celebrating the first year of Scan4Safety

In 2016, six Acute Trusts in England were awarded a share of £12m by the Department of Health to demonstrate the benefits of GS1 standards.

This programme is called Scan4Safety and in January 2017, it celebrated its first birthday.


